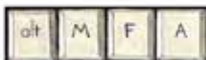
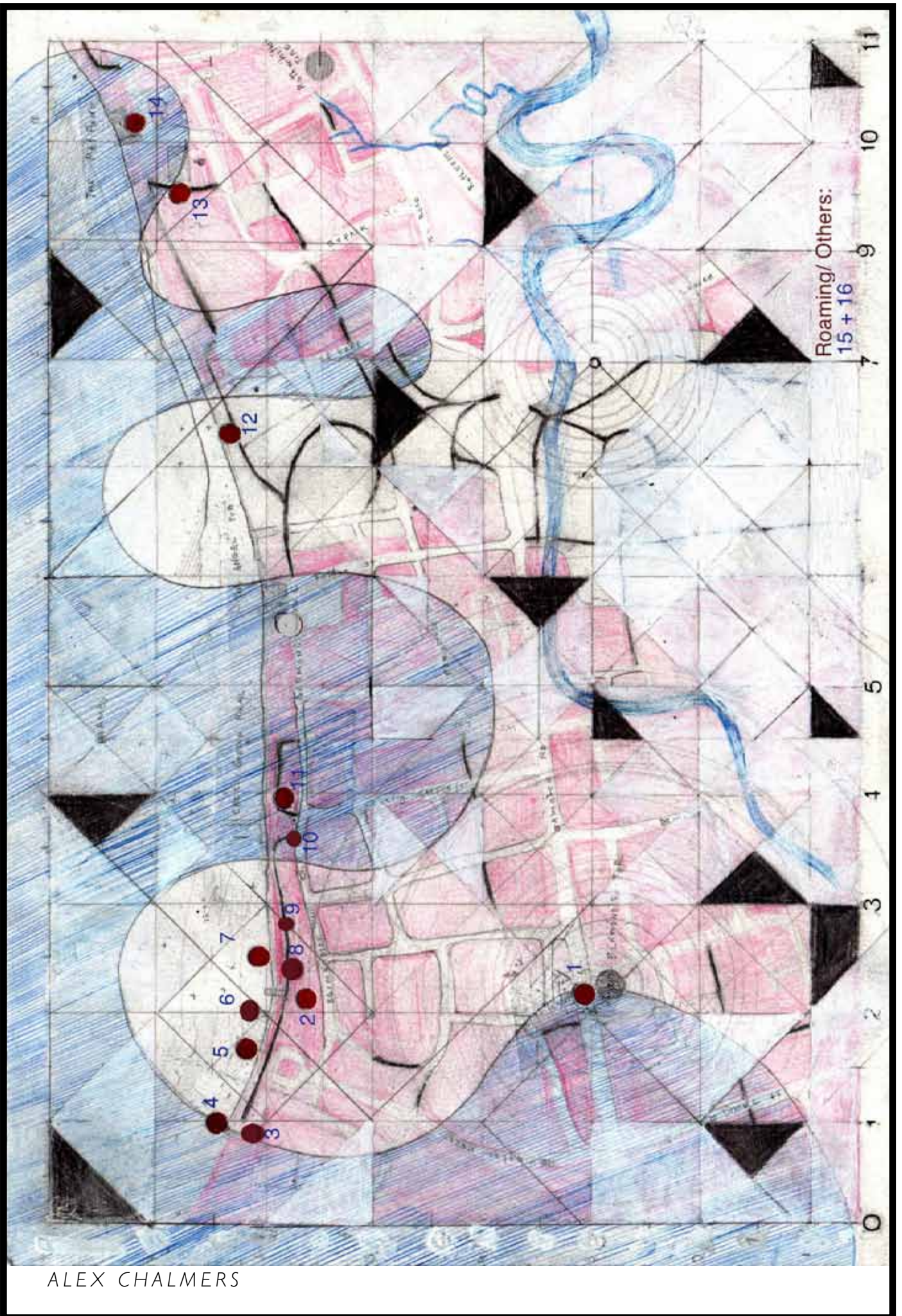

## START Bermondsey Station

### Artists Works:

- 1) Alex Chalmers 'Projeny'  
Balloon Performance.
- 2) Marion Tu 'Wool, needle and promotion.'  
Quilting a new blanket for winter.
- 3) Amy Leung 'c-o-m-b'  
*Beached ceramics, if my hands were the tide.*
  
- 4) Asher Herr 'Dispatches'  
Photographic C-type Print.
- 5) Maru Rojas 'Eppur si muove' Action. Slime removal from Thames wall  
*Eppur si muove = and yet it moves. Galileo's response to the Church's denial of the Earth moving around the Sun. The phrase now becomes "... and yet it IS moved".*
- 6) Louise Ashcroft and Fritha Jenkins 'Shorecore'.  
Performance with violin and live sculptural score.
  
- 7) Gillian Duffy 'The Scattering'  
Action with bread dough.
- 8) Shinji Toya 'Forwards/Backwards'  
*Explores the perception of palindromic flow presented through digital lens. The surreally modified video of the waves will be shown in a site-specific manner at the shore where the video was originally shot.*
- 9) Louise Ashcroft and Fritha Jenkins 'Artificial Seam'.  
Red silk bags of coal and bones, gleaned from the Thames shore.
  
- 10) Paula Bourke-Girgis 'Selfie'.
- 11) Sadie Edginton 'tidal tracks: each leaf is present'.  
Leaves found on site, thread, text, paper.  
*The leaves re-wrap the trees. Tidal lines, backwards wave sounds make this an action in reverse.*
- 12) Louise Ashcroft 'Muscle Man'. Giclée print of collage.
  
- 13) Rebecca Olajide 'Wash the sins, not only the face'  
**ΝΙΨΟΝ ΑΝΗΜΗΜΑΤΑ ΜΗ ΜΟΝΑΝ ΟΨΙΝ** meaning "Wash [the] sins, not only [the] face;  
*a Greek palindromic text normally found on church fonts where the public baptismal process of spiritual cleansing takes place.*
  
- 14) Ben Newell 'A Pilgrim's Fabric - A Discursive Historical Poem (Intertwined with the hidden entities of a past history)'  
*The Mayflower pub stands on the site of The Shippe pub that dates back to around 1550. It was close to where the Mayflower ship was fitted out for the long transatlantic voyage of the Pilgrims in 1620 to America. A historical lesson come poem come anecdote.*
- 16) Paula Bourke-Girgis 'Sponge Lady'.

- 15) Eldi Dundee 'MirrorWalk: A rear-view ramble through the backstreets of Bermondsey'

END The Mayflower Pub

Cross over the pelican crossing  
Continue straight forward along the path,  
Past the playground...continue.  
Turn right; past the basketball court,  
along Scott Lidgett Crescent.  
Continue straight ahead on Janeway Street,  
until you reach Emba Street.  
Turn left on Emba Street.  
Turn right (opposite the school) along Farncombe Street.  
At the Old Justice pub, walk straight ahead to the waterfront.  
Turning right, walk along the Thames path.  
There is a concourse overlooking the river.  
Climb down the steps and onto the beach.  
Look right.  
Look left.  
Walk left, along the shore.  
Continue along until you reach the pier timbers  
Head back, up the steps and onto the concourse again.  
Turn left in the direction of canary wharf,  
walking along the river path,  
past the trees.  
Continue, along the Thames path, through Cherry Gardens.  
Follow Thames path through Cornets Wharf,  
past The Angel pub.  
Remain along the riverside,  
walking through the covered walkway.  
At the end of the walkway, bear right and turn left along  
the cobbled Rotherhithe Street.  
Visit the garden of St Mary's Church as you pass.  
Continue to the Mayflower Pub for a story and a pint.

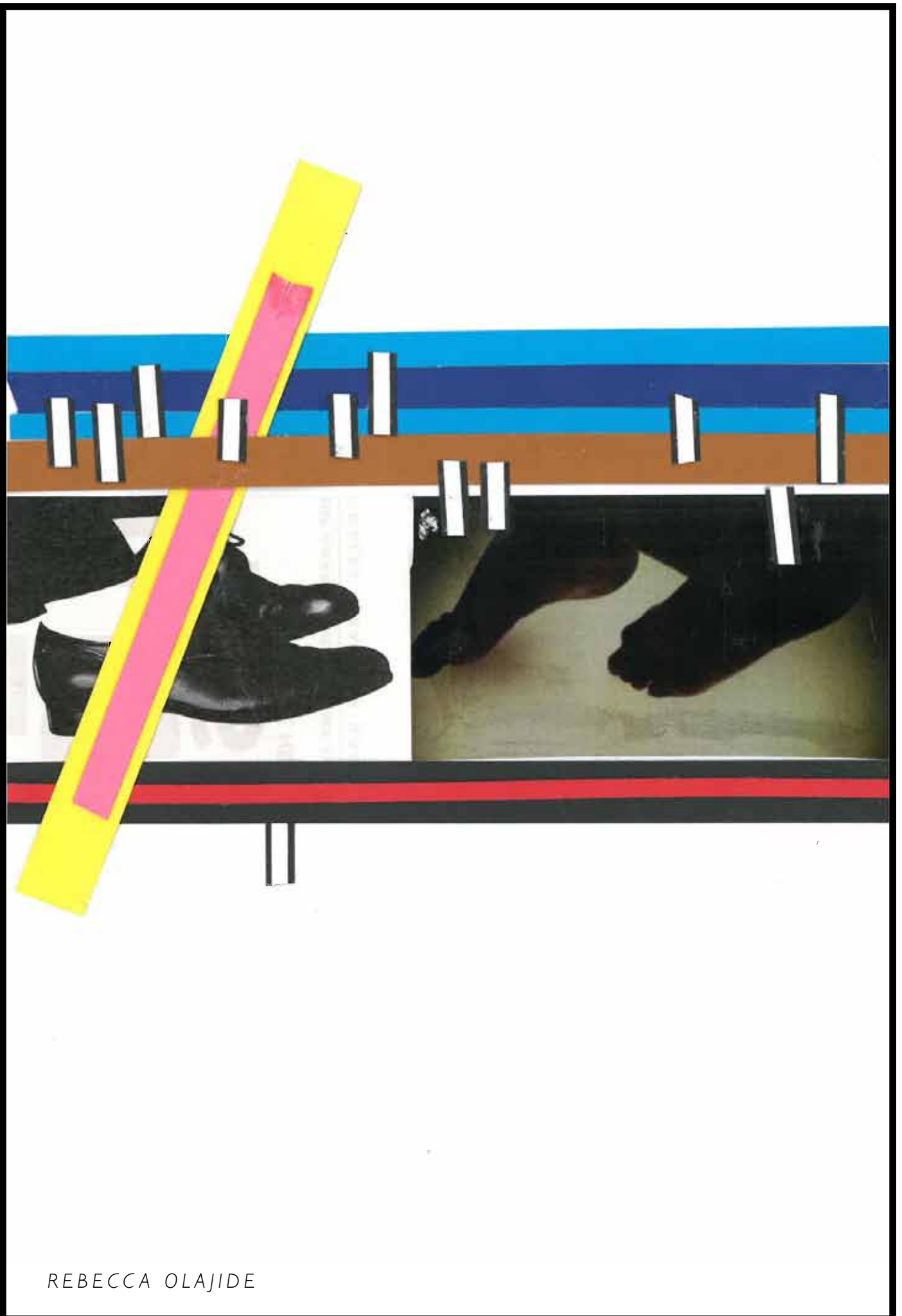
